



EDWARD F. AND PAULA H. ARPS MASTER OF ENGINEERING (M.ENG) TUITION FELLOWSHIP FOR CORNELL CREW PARTICIPANTS

Ned Arps was a civil engineering student in the 1950s and as a student, rowed on the heavyweight crew for four years. He understands the demands of a schedule that combines athletics and scholarship, and he appreciates the discipline required to succeed in both pursuits. That is why he and his wife, Paula, decided to show their support through a scholarship especially for engineer athletics.

Eligibility:

To be eligible for the Edward F. and Paula H. Arps Fellowship, a student should:

- be admitted into the Cornell Master of Engineering program
- be enrolled in the Graduate School
- be a US citizen
- have been a Cornell undergraduate
- have participated in the Cornell crew program a minimum of three years

Award:

The amount of the fellowship will vary, depending on the availability of funds and the number of awardees.

Application deadlines and procedures:

The application deadline for this fellowship is **February 1**—for fall and spring semesters of the following academic year. Admitted applicants will receive a notification about their award, together with, or soon after, their offer of admission.

Late applications will be considered subject to availability of funds. Awards are not made retroactively, i.e. after the student has paid the tuition fee for the semester. Therefore, to be considered for awards in the fall and spring semesters of the same academic year students must file their fellowship application by July 1. To be considered for an award in the spring only, students must submit their application by December 1.
